

(Psalm 103:3, Romans 3:24, Ephesians 2:8) 7. We believe that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, totally apart from human merit, and that the experience of regeneration produces a new creature in Christ. (John 13:35, Romans 8:16, I John 3:23)

10. We believe in the bodily resurrection of the just and the unjust, the everlasting blessedness of the saved, and the everlasting punishment of the lost. (I Thessalonians 4:13-18, Revelations 20:11-15)

# **Educational Objectives for LCA Students**

### For each student's spiritual and moral growth, the school seeks:

- To teach the Bible as God's inspired Word and to develop attitudes of love and respect toward it.
- To teach the basic doctrines of the Bible.

• To lead the student to a decision of confessing Christ as Savior and Lord.

• To develop a desire to know and obey the will of God as revealed in the Scriptures.

• To equip the student to carry out the will of God daily.

• To impart an understanding of each Christian's place in

the church and its worldwide task of witnessing,

evangelism, discipline, and to stimulate each student's involvement in the task.

• To develop the mind of Christ toward godliness and sin and to teach the students how to overcome sin.

• To encourage the development of self-discipline and

responsibility in the student based on respect for and submission to God and all other authority.

• To help the student develop for himself a Christian world view by integrating life and studies with the Bible.

### For each student's personal and social development, the school aims:

• To help the student develop his/her personality based on a proper understanding and acceptance of himself as a unique individual created in the image of God and on the fullest possible development of his/her own capabilities.

# **Academic Information**

#### **Achievement and Homework Policy**

In order to receive the maximum benefit from the education program, an average of 45 minutes of homework will be expected for each hour of class in the core academic subjects. For MS/HS students, 5th - 6th grade should expect 4 - 6 hours of homework a week, while for 7th - 12th graders, 8 - 12 hours of homework a week is suggested. For Elementary students, the homework load will range from 15 - 20 minutes a night for K-5 and 1st grades, and up to 30 - 60 minutes a night for students in 2nd – 4th grades. Parents have the opportunity to monitor their child's progress by accessing the Renweb site. Parents must first submit an e-mail address and receive a password to access their child's academic information.

Parents can be of help to their children by providing an atmosphere conducive to study in the evenings and on the weekends. It is also important that the student have a teachable spirit and a desire to learn. Each student needs to cultivate a sense of responsibility concerning the learning process, doing all his/her work as unto the Lord. Self-motivation and self-discipline are essential ingredients in the learning process. Students are encouraged to get their assignments in advance if they anticipate an evening that will be too busy for homework (i.e., game night, church activity, etc.). Plan ahead! Mutual respect between teachers and students will create an atmosphere in which learning will flourish.

#### Tests

School policy requires that all tests be announced at least 48 hours in advance for all students. This does not apply to quizzes.

# Athletics

### **The Role of Athletics**

Athletics is an excellent means to teach Christian character, not just for the athlete, but also for the whole student body. Athletic competition provides the opportunity for the training of the Christian athlete's mind, will, and emotions.

Christians are commanded to be different from the world and the competitive nature of athletes stirs up the will and emotions. By the development of Christian character traits like patience, endurance, self-control, brotherly love, dependability, loyalty, and humility, the will and emotions can be controlled with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Participation in athletics initiates students into the order and stewardship of their own bodies. It leads them to the excitement of competition and cooperation, of care for self, and respect for others.

Athletics offer the opportunity to be an effective witness to those in our community. When non-Christian players and fans see the behavior and attitude expressed by Christian athletes it should be in sharp contrast to the attitude of the world. This gives proper attention to Christ and witness to His power.

The Christian athlete is responsible to God for maintaining this positive witness through our athletic contests. We are developing not only our physical abilities, but we are developing eternal values.

This is our philosophy at LCA and this is what makes our program unique. We also place a strong emphasis on the coach/athlete relationship, knowing that a strong role model in this area is important for a program to be successful. Life Christian's athletic program is characterized by a history of success in all our sports programs, which include MS and HS football, MS and HS volleyball, and elementary soccer in the fall, Elementary, MS, and HS girl's and boys' Basketball in the winter, Elementary softball and baseball, MS and HS track, HS golf, soccer, or tennis in the spring.
